Dear Friends,

Each year we have had our highest attendance for Christmas. It is always such a joy to share the Gospel with over 100 people on Christmas. However, it never ceases that our January and February church attendance is low. So this year, we expected that to happen. However, the attendance was only a little lower than usual, and in fact God has blessed us with quite a few visitors! One visitor got saved, and one prisoner got saved! Please pray for their spiritual growth.

This past Christmas we had the opportunity to present the Gospel to the students and faculty at Mai Ngam School. Since then the Lord has opened the doors for us to present the Gospel in this public school on a weekly basis. Richard and Marah have been teaching English and Bible in the school each week to the children there. It's a great chance for the students to be able to hear the Bible taught over time, and for us to be an example to them. Please pray for these children and their teachers to be receptive to the Gospel!

While activities and special teaching are important ways to reach new people, sometimes the best opportunities can come from our everyday activities and witnessing. We live in a small town, and occasional flea markets and carnivals are very popular since there are few other large events here. These are always great chances to pass out tracts and meet new people. During one such festival recently, Richard handed tracts to a family we'd never met before. The wife was very interested in coming, but not the husband. Much to our surprise, the whole family came, first to English class and soon after to our Sunday church service. They've now come for the past 4 Sundays in a row! The husband said he was anti-Christian before, but is now very interested in knowing more about Jesus. Please pray for this family to be saved! It's definitely encouraging to see the results of handing out tracts!

Gu, one of our church members, just moved to Taiwan for a job. He will be gone for 2 years. Please pray for him. He has only been a Christian for a year, and now he won't be able to go to a Thai church, and it is unlikely that he will have other Thai speaking Christians to encourage him.

Please continue to pray for Kristi's health problem. She had a lot of improvement during the cool season, but as the weather has warmed up, her pain and weakness have gotten worse again. The neurologist and urologist recommended that she see a neuro-muscular specialist. She now has an appointment for next week.

Thank you so much for your part in our work here. Through your prayers, support, and encouragement, you are helping us reach souls for the Lord.
