Dear Friends,

It has been exciting watching God working in the lives of the people here. Two teenage boys started coming to church on Christmas. Then they began to come to almost every service. At first, they both seemed rather rough, but each week they seemed more and more interested in the Gospel. Then 2 weeks ago, they both were saved! One of the boys said that he didn't know where he would be if we hadn't invited him to church. He said that he has never had so much peace before. Please pray for their spiritual growth.

We are planning a special service for Easter morning. Please pray that many new people will attend the service. The teens are going to sing together, so we hope some of their families will come to hear them. Then in the afternoon, we will have a baptism service at a nearby waterfall. Please also pray that we will get permission to do a special Easter program at the prison.

Please continue to pray for our cars to be dependable. Both cars have had to be worked on many times lately. One car has broken down 3 times in the last couple of weeks while picking up and taking people home from church. We are so thankful that everyone was safe, and that we were able to afford the repairs. Both cars are needed for our church "bus" routes, as we pick up the majority of the people that come to church.

Thank you for praying about Kristi's health problems. She was diagnosed with Celiac Disease. Even though there is not a cure for the disease, she can manage the problem by avoiding gluten. We still aren't sure if that is the whole problem, but we are very thankful for the improvement that she has already seen.

We would like to ask prayer for something that is an unpleasant topic. We know that someday our church will need a cemetery. At the moment we are still using a rented building for our church. Our church is still very small and not self-supporting. It may be a very long time before the church members will be able to afford to buy or build a church. Yet, we have wondered if the Christians here will have a need for a cemetery before the money could be saved to buy land. Since Buddhist people always cremate, there are very few cemeteries in Thailand. We hope that it will be many years before our church really needs a cemetery, but we would like you to join us in praying for God to provide a cemetery in our area before it is needed.
