Thank you for your prayers for us and our ministry. God has been working in people's hearts. Since our last letter, many people have been saved! We just had a baptism for 3 of the people last week. Many children at the school have gotten saved too. One 18 year old from Burma came into one of the services at the school a little late. He sat in the back and looked so shy, but he listened so intently. Then as soon as the service ended, he went and asked Richard questions about salvation. He trusted in Jesus that day. He left with the biggest smile on his face! Each week he comes early to help set up and stays to help us pick up. School is out for a month now, but we are looking forward to going back next month!



We have also been having visitors at church almost every Sunday morning! We have always had a steady stream of new kids visit our church, but lately we are having quite a bit of adult visitors! It is such a blessing to finally have whole families coming to church! Please pray for them to understand the Gospel!

Please keep praying for Oat. As you may recall he had run away from home, robbed his parents, and then was arrested. He was released into our custody. However he ran away from here too. In the past 10 months he has been in juvenile once, was sent home, and ran away again and again. He had his wrist cut badly during a knife fight. Even after surgery, he can barely move his hand. Then last week, just a few days after his 16th birthday, he was sentenced to a year in juvenile. He has made several professions of faith, but it appears that he hasn't really meant them. Please pray for Oat to realize how much he needs God! Please pray for his family as they are going through this difficult time.

As Kristi was visiting with Oat's family at the police station last week, she got a great chance to witness to a police officer. He eagerly asked her question after question about God. Please pray for him to come to church and learn more.

Our English classes are still bringing in lots of people and providing opportunities to share the Gospel. We are so blessed that God has provided this tool to help us get to know people. We recently had the police station, an internet company, and a community

college ask if Richard could come teach. After each English lesson, he always teaches a Bible lesson, so we hope that he will be able to teach in all of those places!

Kristi, Joshua, and Micah had a safe trip to America in August. They enjoyed the time of visiting with family and friends. Kristi had the joy of getting to see 2 of her nephews saved and baptized too! Joshua likes it there at Crown College, and Kristi and Micah are safely back at home!

Though this has been the hardest year of our lives, we are thankful that God has helped us to focus on what needs to be done each day, and has allowed us to see much fruit for our labors this year. He is truly a Great Comforter. We are sure many of you are still lifting us up in prayer. Thank you! We still need prayer, and we are blessed to have so many people praying for us.
